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SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The subject files of William H. Hastie, the Civilian Aide to the Secretary of War, chronicle the daily struggle faced by African Americans serving in the military during the Second World War. This collection, *African Americans in the Military, Part 2: Subject Files of Judge William Hastie, Civilian Aide to the Secretary of War*, includes correspondence between the Office of the Civilian Aide and the soldiers, sailors, family members, and other interested parties concerning the ongoing discrimination in the military. As in the first part of this collection the folders are arranged alphabetically. Many of the events, however, occur in the final stages of the war or even after the hostilities ceased. Hastie resigned his position in early 1943 and Truman K. Gibson Jr., his assistant, was promoted to fill the vacancy.

The first reel of this collection is a testament to the courageous and faithful service of African American soldiers. This reel contains extensive lists of the awards and recognition earned by African Americans. In many cases, these lists contain biographic information about the recipient and details of the events surrounding the awards. Most of the remaining collection shows the violent history of segregation and racism.

The Office of the Civilian Aide was responsible not only for investigating the grievances of soldiers—Hastie, Gibson, and their assistant, James C. Evans, also fought against racism and discrimination in civilian organizations. Due to wartime necessity, many civilian plants were converted to produce the materials needed to ensure victory. Since this production was essential to the war effort, many of these plants became the jurisdiction of the secretary of war. Much of the collection focuses on discrimination and racism present in these industries. These reports vary from the innocuous, unsupported claims of those fired for non-performance of duty, to more sinister events, including the denial of promotions and raises to current employees, the mysterious disappearance of job opportunities upon the discovery of an applicant's race, and the termination of African Americans' employment while preserving comparable positions held by whites.

While the discrimination uncovered in the civilian war industries was troubling and damaging to the war effort, the same racism took on a more violent tone in the armed services. This collection is filled with reports of violence, armed and unarmed, between African American soldiers and white military policemen, civilian authorities, or civilians from the towns that surrounded the military bases. The extent of racism and violence is apparent in a telegram from Walter White, the secretary of the NAACP, reporting a massacre of African American soldiers at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. In his telegram he states, "It is rumored that more than one hundred Negro soldiers were killed or wounded." While this incident indeed proved to be only a rumor, the fact that White found it plausible that this sort of violence could occur speaks directly to the fear and uncertainty of the era.

The remaining folders of this collection contain records of the daily actions of the Office of the Civilian Aide. Many documents concerning the official travel of Gibson and Evans are present, as are many personal letters, notes, and telegraph messages from family and friends. In the months and years following the war, many soldiers sought the assistance of the Civilian Aide in finding permanent employment. In many cases, these

soldiers were involuntarily released from the military, even as they attempted to make a career of their military service.

Other collections of interest from LexisNexis include *The William H. Hastie Papers*, a collection of Judge Hastie's personal and judicial papers and documents relating to civil rights. Of interest to scholars of African American history, LexisNexis offers a collection of NAACP records, *Papers of the NAACP*, which include administrative, educational and legislative documents produced by the NAACP. The subject files of William H. Hastie, the Civilian Aide to the Secretary of War, chronicle the daily struggle faced by African Americans serving in the military during the Second World War. This collection, *African Americans in the Military, Part 2: Subject Files of Judge William Hastie, Civilian Aide to the Secretary of War*, includes correspondence between the Office of the Civilian Aide and the soldiers, sailors, family members, and other interested parties concerning the ongoing discrimination in the military.

The first reel of this collection is a testament to the courageous and faithful service of African American soldiers. This reel contains extensive lists of the awards and recognition earned by African Americans. In many cases, these lists contain biographic information about the recipient and details of the events surrounding the awards. Most of the remaining collection shows the violent history of segregation and racism in the military and in civilian industries supporting the war effort.

Due to wartime necessity, many civilian plants were converted to produce the materials needed to ensure victory. Since this production was essential to the war effort, many of these plants became the jurisdiction of the secretary of war. Much of the collection focuses on discrimination and racism present in these industries. These reports vary from the innocuous, unsupported claims of those fired for non-performance of duty, to more sinister events, including the denial of promotions and raises to current employees, the mysterious disappearance of job opportunities upon the discovery of an applicant's race, and the termination of African Americans' employment while preserving comparable positions held by whites.
