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SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This edition contains case files from the NAACP Legal Department for the western and mid-western states between 1956 and 1965. The cases involve school desegregation, employment and housing discrimination, questions of criminal procedure, rights of free expression, and disciplinary actions against local NAACP branches. There are several major cases among the files in this edition, including cases on school desegregation in Cleveland and Cincinnati, Ohio, Gary, Indiana, and San Francisco and Sacramento, California. There are also major employment discrimination cases against the Seafarer's International Union in California, the St. Louis and San Francisco Railroad Co., and the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen. Two extensive cases cover the Detroit, Michigan, housing desegregation battle. There are numerous smaller but substantive case files from California, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, Missouri, Nevada, Ohio, and South Dakota. It is not known whether additional cases from the Mid- and Far West for the 1956–1965 period will be deposited at the Library of Congress in the future.

The NAACP Legal Department evolved as a major force in civil rights litigation after Thurgood Marshall separated the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund (LDEF) from the NAACP proper in 1957. The separation was made in order to preserve the federal “tax exempt” status that the LDEF enjoyed as a nonprofit, nonpolitical arm of the NAACP. After the success of *Brown v. Board of Education* in 1954, enemies of the NAACP challenged the LDEF tax-exempt status, charging that the NAACP was a political organization that was spearheading civil rights legislation. Marshall convinced the NAACP Board of Directors that they needed to separate the LDEF from the NAACP proper. With the Board's approval in 1957, Marshall led the LDEF to a new status, independent of the NAACP parent organization. Marshall pressed ahead with litigation to bring nationwide compliance with the *Brown* desegregation ruling. The LDEF also continued to take up cases to vindicate voting rights, fair housing and employment opportunities, and to defend the constitutional rights of African Americans in criminal proceedings.

In the meanwhile, Robert L. Carter succeeded Marshall as General Counsel to the NAACP. His duties entailed serving the corporate legal needs of the organization, including adjudicating internal NAACP disputes and defending the association itself from hostile actions of state governments in the South. However, a neat division of labor between Marshall's LDEF and Carter's

NAACP Legal Department was soon blurred. This was in part a result of Carter's responsibility to represent or assist local NAACP leaders who, in their official capacity as branch presidents or state conference leaders, became involved in civil rights litigation. Some local leaders became embroiled in criminal prosecutions because of their civil rights work in the South. Others were subject to civil injunctions to stop local branches from picketing and demonstrating. Carter's office therefore defended constitutional safeguards in criminal proceedings and first amendment rights of expression just as Marshall's LDEF did. In addition, local NAACP branch leaders often spearheaded desegregation drives by filing as petitioners in cases. This also drew Carter's office into many of the same types of cases that Marshall was litigating through the LDEF, including school desegregation and desegregation of public facilities. However, another factor in the Legal Department's willingness to enter all sort of civil rights cases is that Carter never agreed with Marshall that it was necessary to separate the LDEF from the NAACP. He was personally willing to have his office of General Counsel continue, in the tradition that Marshall had begun, as a resource in all cases where there was a promise of attaining or strengthening the legal rights of African Americans.

The cases in this edition are grouped alphabetically by state and thereunder alphabetically by the name of the petitioner. Throughout the collection, larger cases are further subdivided into file series of Background Material, General Case Material, and Withdrawn Case Material. Background Material typically includes correspondence and exhibits. In school desegregation cases the background material sometimes also includes detailed sociological information on local communities and their public school populations. General Case Material includes correspondence between the local attorneys or branch leaders and attorneys from the national office, including Carter and his assistants. Withdrawn Case Material includes legal documents such as briefs, motions, and depositions. Some cases also include trial transcripts in the Withdrawn Case Material series. Finally, the last four reels of the microfilm (reels 24–27) contain oversize and bound materials pertaining to earlier cases in this collection. The material filmed as reel 24—union constitutions, agreements, and work rules pertaining to the employment discrimination case against the Saint Louis–San Francisco Railroad—should have been filmed subsequent to reel 27 where the other bound materials pertaining to that case are filmed. The reel index for the earlier cases cross references these items for each case.

The reel index portion of the user guide lists every file of the collection and provides citations to the original container in the NAACP collection as well as a listing of the major topics and principal correspondents of each file. The major topics and principal correspondents are in turn indexed in subject and correspondents indexes at the back of the user guide.

Researchers should note that there are three companion editions of NAACP Legal Department case files as well as related editions of subject files for the 1956–1965 period. *Part 22, Legal Department Administrative Files, 1956–1965*, contains the complete deposit of Robert L. Carter’s administrative office files for the period. This includes his general correspondence and memoranda files, subject files, and files in connection with adjudication of internal NAACP disputes. The correspondence and memoranda files may include material on cases or on communities that are part of this edition. Of particular note are the memoranda of June Shagaloff, an assistant to Carter who was charged with studying patterns of *de facto* school segregation outside the south. There are also two companion editions of *Legal Department Case Files, Series A: The South* and *Series B: The Northeast*. Finally, there are separate subject series of NAACP papers that bear upon the matters of litigation in this edition. These include supplements for *Part 1: Meetings of the Board of Directors, Records of Annual Conferences, Major Speeches, and Special Reports; Part 3, The Campaign for Educational Equality, Series D, General Office Files, 1956–1965; Part 5, Residential Segregation, General Office Files, 1956–1965; and Part 13, The NAACP and Labor, 1956–1965*. Each of these editions can be surveyed through their printed user guides, which include subject and correspondent indexes.

NOTE ON SOURCES

The records microfilmed for this edition come from Group V, Series B, of the NAACP Collection held by the Manuscript Division of the Library of Congress, Washington, D.C.

EDITORIAL NOTE

This edition was compiled by Professors John H. Bracey Jr. and August Meier after a complete survey of the records of the NAACP Legal Department for the period before 1965 deposited at the Library of Congress and classified as Group V of the NAACP collection. Every mid- and far-western case file was selected for the edition. Each file has been microfilmed in its entirety.
