SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Part 2 of the *Dwight D. Eisenhower National Security Files, 1953–1961*, comprises the Presidential Files. These files consist of two subseries: the NSC Briefing Notes, which are arranged alphabetically by subject, and the Special Assistant subseries, which contains the President's Papers, 1953–1957, and Meetings with the President, 1958–1961. Together these files provide insight into the reach of the cold war into American policy. Consisting of 17 reels and 348 folders, the correspondence and records detail a range of issues centered on national security and foreign affairs, in which the threats of Soviet nuclear attack and of Sino-Soviet Communist world influence are key.

Cold war defense issues are foremost among the records. Issues include nuclear weapons, the perceived imminent threat of nuclear attack, radioactive fallout and its medical and psychological effects (Reel 6, Frame 0765), civil defense and fallout shelters (Reel 2, Frame 0683), emergency warning systems, chemical and biological warfare (Reel 2, Frame 0608), psychological warfare, the research and development of new weapons systems (Reel 11, Frame 0091), missile systems (Reels 4 and 5) and the rise of a modern Air Force (Reels 10–12), the concepts of limited war (Reel 10, Frame 0001) and continental defense (Reel 3, Frame 0805), defense mobilization and readiness, comparative assessments and U.S. and Soviet military and weapons capabilities (Reel 13, Frame 0593), and the use of martial law and presidential powers in times of emergency (Reel 4, Frame 0482 presents a chronology and historical precedent for expanded presidential powers.)

The collection reveals the expansive growth of U.S. intelligence services—internal, foreign, and military—and the key roles of the National Security Council, Central Intelligence Agency, Federal Bureau of Investigation, and Operations Coordinating Board in communicating cold war threats to and from the White House. These internal communications provide insight into the mechanics of Eisenhower's chain-of-command of special assistants and security advisors and consultants.

Foreign relations, by country and by world region, often appear as inextricable from defense matters, as in the specific cases of the Cuban crisis that attended Fidel Castro's rise to power (Reel 4, Frames 0041 and 0103) and the capture of Gary Powers's U-2 spy plane by the Soviet Union (Reel 13, Frames 0716 and 0870). Reports of both incidents include minute-by-minute chronologies. Many such records detail attempts through diplomacy or direct assistance (foreign aid, military aid, food aid) to gird underdeveloped countries against the influences of Sino-Soviet Communism and propaganda. Cultural exchange programs were aimed similarly (e.g., Reel 14, Frame 0368.) There are also extensive records relating to assistance to defectors and refugees from Communist areas, especially from the Hungarian Revolution (Reel 7, Frame 0087.)

The energy dependence of the United States upon Middle East oil is detailed at some length (Reel 10, Frame 0253; Reel 11, Frame 0505), with strategies laid out for averting the dangers of cartels (Reel 11, Frame 0336) and other inherent vulnerabilities, including by way of development of nuclear and solar energy alternatives (Reel 16, Frame 0769 details desalinization and solar energy research). Foreign trade, antitrust law, export controls on Soviet Bloc nations, and the security of U.S. ports are related subjects (Reel 11, Frame 0541.) In the area of scientific cooperation, the sharing of certain military technologies and peaceful uses of nuclear energy with allies is debated (Reel 12, Frame 0583.)

Contemporary accounts of other historical events and turning points include China's "Great Leap Forward" (Reel 3, Frame 0279), tensions with Khrushchev leading to the Berlin Crisis of 1961 (Reel 6, Frame 0466), the First and Second Taiwan Strait Crises (Reel 13, Frame 0166), analyses of Khrushchev's 7-year economic plan (Reel 13, Frame 0452), the Arab-Israeli Conflict and the difficulties of U.S. foreign relations with the Middle East (Reel 10, Frame 0186), the Korean War and its aftermath (Reels 9, 15, and 16), and the development of the Voice of America and other radio to disseminate U.S. propaganda (Reel 14, Frame 0482.)

Intelligence on matters of domestic and international security concerns plays heavily in this collection. A considerable number of records exist on the cooperation of U.S. investigative and intelligence gathering agencies, the classification of government information, and espionage and counterintelligence activities, many involving the Central Intelligence Agency.

At the center of most of the documents is the National Security Council, with correspondence detailing the involvement of cabinet and agency-level officials. Three individuals stand out as far the most prolific correspondents, each figuring prominently as issuers of correspondence in some seventy-five or more document folders (a rate three times that of the next tier of individuals indexed as Principal Correspondents):

- Gordon Gray (1909–1982), head of the Office of Defense Mobilization, 1957–1958 and special assistant for National Security Affairs, 1958–1961;
- Robert Cutler (1895–1974), whose positions included special assistant for National Security Affairs in 1953–1955 and 1957–1958; and
- James S. Lay Jr. (1912–1987), executive secretary of the National Security Council, 1950–1961, and deputy assistant to the director of the Central Intelligence Agency, 1961–1964.

Other notable, if less frequently cited names include Dillon Anderson, national security advisor; J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation; John Foster Dulles, secretary of state; Nelson A. Rockefeller, whose Special Studies Project reports included perspectives on Latin America (Reel 9, Frame 0429) and psychological aspects of the cold war (Reel 11, Frame 0904); and Philip J. Halla and Charles A. Haskins.
