INTRODUCTION

East Asia was a chaotic region in the 1960s. Worldwide, that decade marked the height of post–World War II U.S. globalism as well as the climax of “Cold Warriorism.” In Japan, the politicization of the populace and economic growth were the orders of the day.

The 1960s in Japan were marked by political conflict, as opposition parties in the Diet vigorously opposed and denounced the security treaties with the United States, particularly the revised Security Treaty of 1960; by concerns over Japan’s changing democratic ideals, political parties, and governmental reforms; by dramatic industrial and manufacturing growth, intrusive foreign trade, and labor movements; and by increasing popular criticism of Japan’s alignment with the United States, external security issues, and U.S. foreign policy in Asia. All of these supported the dramatic politicization of the populace and the creation of citizens’ movements.

The revision of the U.S.–Japan Security Treaty became the catalyst for political opposition during 1960 (and throughout the decade when the treaty was renewed). The popular suspicion that Prime Minister Kishi Nobusuke’s revised treaty would associate Japan even more with Washington’s military and foreign policies fueled growing domestic opposition. The tension was exacerbated in May 1960 with the collapse of the U.S.–USSR summit following the shooting down of an American U-2 spy plane. The Japanese opposition charged that the plane was one of many based in Japan that had been used for overflights of Soviet territory. President Eisenhower’s imminent visit to Japan, far from being perceived as a goodwill tour to cement U.S.–Japanese cooperation, was increasingly denounced by the opposition as a provocative act designed to highlight the war-preparedness of American military bases in Asia. This, together with Kishi’s arbitrary methods in obtaining treaty ratification in the Diet, sparked large anti-American, neutralist, and pacifist demonstrations throughout Japan, particularly in Tokyo. By June 16, following two weeks of demonstrations and threats, Eisenhower cancelled his Tokyo visit. With the Diet’s passage of the treaty the demonstrations subsided, but they had already politicized a generally “apolitical people.”

The 1960s opened with the shocking assassination of Japan’s Socialist Party chairman, Asanuma Inejiro, by a right-wing extremist during a televised political rally. The established parties, Liberal Democratic and Socialist,

solidified their structures only to have them splinter over a variety of domestic and foreign issues. The 1960s saw a trebling of political parties. While the Liberal Democratic and Socialist parties were the most popular, a coalition of smaller parties, particularly the Clean Government Party and the Democratic Socialist Party, incessantly caused problems for the established parties and created confusion in the voting populace. From the mid- to late 1960s, compromise increasingly replaced the confrontation evident earlier in the decade, as ideological polarization became less apparent. It is generally accepted that by the mid-1960s, opposition parties were willing to play by the “parliamentary rules” and accepted the “institutionalization of conflict management” in the Diet. In general, however, public discontent remained and controversy regarding the ambiguities in the Japan–U.S. relationship flared up regularly.

Following the fall of Kishi in July 1960, Ikeda Hayato became prime minister. Ikeda sought to avoid the politics of confrontation that characterized Kishi’s regime and promised to focus government attention on economic growth and increased consumption. The “economic miracle” of Japan began in the 1950s. U.S. economic and trade incentives were intended to bolster Japan’s self-sufficiency and support Japanese trade with Southeast Asia and South Korea. With U.S. economic and financial aid, Japan built up her war-shattered nonmilitary industries. The lack of a need to spend money on defense goods led to an increase in the production of consumer commodities. By the 1960s, Japanese exports of cars, washing machines, radios, and electronic technology were growing at a rapid pace; trade with all countries, including Communist China, was encouraged by the Japanese government.

The economic stability and popular politicization of Japan created problems in the U.S.–Japanese relationship. While the United States continued economic aid, a trade rivalry developed. Goods produced cheaply by decentralized, independent, smaller, and technologically advanced companies counteracted the U.S. dual manufacturing structure of the 1950s (small companies producing parts for use by larger companies). This competition began seriously to affect many U.S. consumer goods companies and heavy industries. Even in the field of defense economics Japan blossomed, due in part to the U.S. need for increased production of military equipment, aircraft, and hardware. U.S. military technology was made available to Japan, particularly during the Vietnam War years. Japanese-produced military equipment was also sold to Western allies and nonaligned nations.

U.S.–Japanese relations were not only economic; security and the U.S. Asian policy were the cornerstones of the relationship. For Japan, as for most countries, foreign relations in the postwar era developed within the overarching nuclear balance between the United States and the USSR in the context of the cold war. The central principle of Japan’s foreign policy was the

desire to maintain close ties to the United States—this principle was supported and solidified in the tenets of U.S. Asian policy. But the 1960s saw Japanese initiatives to expand its foreign relations, including the recognition of Communist China in 1964. Japanese foreign policy supported an open, stable, peaceful world trading order, which was evident in the pattern of Japan's relations with Southeast Asia. The United States, however, was seen as the great open market for Japanese exports as well as a source of new technology, and so remained central to Japan's foreign policy. Japan pursued a superbly successful foreign policy of expanding its trade without the costs of political involvement or military spending.

U.S. security in Asia was, and still is, predicated on the Pacific Rim Defense System. This consists of a bulwark of military outposts from the Aleutians to Indonesia, including Australia. Japan is a cornerstone of this system, being a short distance from Soviet Sakhalin, South Korea, Communist China, and Formosa. With the peace treaty of 1952, the United States became responsible for Japan's security and supported the rearmament of Japan, much to the chagrin of many Japanese political leaders and the populace. U.S. military aid flowed into Japan consistently throughout the 1950s. By the mid-1960s, Japan was producing large quantities of military armaments both for internal use and for export. Still, the United States continued to maintain the U.S.–Japanese mutual security treaty throughout the 1960s, despite a rise in anti-Americanism. The United States was not going to allow a Pacific Rim cornerstone to move into the realm of neutralism espoused by the Communists and Socialists. In addition, with the escalation of the Vietnam War in 1965, the United States needed the political and industrial support of Japan. An anti–Vietnam War movement was formed in Japan, but it never attained the proportions or influence of the American antiwar movement.

The U.S.–Japanese relationship was to change dramatically by the 1970s. The ascendancy of an economically powerful Japan onto the world stage was finally realized. Within twenty-five years after its defeat in the Second World War, Japan became the third leading industrial power of the world, surpassed only by the United States and the USSR. Prospering and intent on making its democratic machinery work despite social ferment, Japan was a bastion of stability in East Asia.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The U.S. State Department Central Files are the definitive source of American diplomatic reporting on political, military, social, and economic developments throughout the world in the twentieth century. Surpassing the scope of the State Department's *Foreign Relations of the United States (FRUS)* series, the Central Files for an individual country give the researcher extensive coverage of all political, military, social, and economic matters relating to that particular country and/or world event.

The publication of the State Department Central Files for 1960–1966 offers unique opportunities for undergraduate and graduate research. These vast, invaluable, and recently released internal records are available for most countries, covering a crucial period in U.S. and world history. Each part of the 1960–1966 series contains a wide range of primary materials: special reports and observations on political and military affairs; studies and statistics on socioeconomic matters; interviews and minutes of meetings with U.S. and foreign government officials and leaders; legal and claims documentation; full texts of important letters and cables sent and received by U.S. diplomats and embassy personnel; reports, news clippings, and translations from journals and newspapers; and countless high-level head of state government documents, including speeches, memoranda, official reports, aide-mémoires, and transcripts of political meetings and assemblies.

Access to these records will stimulate new insights into the evolution of American foreign policy toward both allies and adversaries and into the shaping of the policies of these countries toward the United States. Of even greater importance for the study of individual countries is the comprehensive manner in which the Central Files illuminate the internal affairs of foreign countries. There are thousands of pages arranged topically and chronologically on crucial subjects: political parties, unrest and revolution, human rights, government administration, fiscal and monetary issues, labor, housing, police and crime, public health and works, national defense, military equipment and supplies, foreign policy making, wars and alliances, education, religion, culture, trade, industry, and natural resources. On these and other subjects, the Central Files offer authoritative, in-depth, and timely documentation and analysis that cannot be matched.

Easy and immediate access to these records will provide many new insights into how nations have shaped their policies toward the United States

and other countries. Of even greater importance, the records illuminate the internal conditions of these nations in exhaustive detail by reproducing thousands of pages on political, governmental, and military affairs as well as economic and social issues. It is this kind of official, in-depth documentation on crucial topics that makes the State Department's Central Files essential for research.

ORGANIZATION OF THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF STATE DECIMAL FILING SYSTEM

From 1910 to 1963 the Department of State used a decimal classification system to organize its Central Files. This system assembled and arranged individual documents according to their subject, with each subject having a specific decimal code. The decimal system from 1950 to January 1963 consists of ten primary classifications numbered 0 through 9, each covering a broad subject area.

CLASS 0: Miscellaneous.

CLASS 1: Administration of the United States Government.

CLASS 2: Protection of Interests (Persons and Property).

CLASS 3: International Conferences, Congresses, Meetings, and Organizations.

CLASS 4: International Trade and Commerce. Trade Relations, Customs Administration.

CLASS 5: International Informational and Educational Relations. Cultural Affairs. Psychological Warfare.

CLASS 6: International Political Relations. Bilateral Treaties.

CLASS 7: Internal Political and National Defense Affairs.

CLASS 8: Internal Economic, Industrial, and Social Affairs.

CLASS 9: Other Internal Affairs. Communications. Transportation. Science.


Internal Affairs

For this section of the U.S. State Department Central Files, University Publications of America (UPA) has microfilmed the documents contained in classes 7, 8, and 9. Within these classes each subject is defined by a decimal

file number, followed by a slant mark (/). The number after the slant mark (/) refers to the date on which the document was generated. Documents within each decimal file number are arranged in chronological order. The entire decimal file number is stamped on the right side of the first page of every document.


These classes are concerned almost exclusively with the internal matters of individual countries. The class number (7, 8, or 9) is followed by the country number, and the number following the decimal point indicates subtopics within the major classifications. The date after the slant mark (/) identifies the individual document.

CLASS 7. Example, 794.13/1-961




794.13/1-961 indicates a document dated January 9, 1961, relating to the cabinet of the executive branch of government (13) in Japan (94).

994.50/5-161 indicates a document dated May 1, 1961, relating to television (50) in Japan (94).




