#### THE PAST INFORMS THE PRESENT

Congressional All provides users with access to our entire collection of congressional content, historical through the present day, facilitating the ability of students, researchers, and teachers to explore ideas in the context of policy changes throughout U.S. history. Users can read primary source congressional texts that expose reoccurring themes informing the events of today such as racism, women's rights, and the role of the U.S. on the global stage. Working with congressional materials fosters understanding of the way the legislative process can work in times of polarization and compromise, times of war and peace, times of economic distress and economic prosperity. Congressional All also offers a large collection of Presidential materials from 1789-present, including not only executive orders and proclamations, but also policy statements, pardons, and many other content types, all shedding light on changes in the relationship between the executive branch and other branches of government over time. The Presidential materials collection can be used to improve understanding of how the President can take actions that have the force of law themselves or that impact the implementation of previously enacted laws. The tension between the

legislative and executive branches has existed from the earliest days of our nation, as public opinion about the separation of powers shifts back and forth.

Whether users begin with the present or a point in the past, access to this collection of primary materials will encourage the development of critical thinking skills needed for learning, research, and citizen participation. For the novice researcher, non-partisan Congressional Research Service (CRS) reports are the perfect place to start, as they explain the issues of the day to Members of Congress. Congressional committee hearings offer differing perspectives through testimony from many types of witnesses such as Administration officials, business leaders, foreign policy experts, economists, Native Americans, civil rights leaders, public health officials, scientists, farmers, environmental advocates, and ordinary citizens. House and Senate reports and documents cover our nation's history from 1789-present, providing a particular focus on events of the 19th and 20th centuries that led up to events of today. Topics touch upon a plethora of information in which Congress has an interest in itself, including public health, law enforcement, civil rights, the Constitution, education, the economy, the environment, foreign relations, and more.
